The Republic of Texas Responds to the WHO Pandemic Treaty

After 3 years of negotiations, a historic pandemic agreement developed by the World Health Organization (WHO) has been finalized and set to be submitted to the World Health Assembly for vote in May 2025.

This pandemic agreement or pandemic treaty was drafted in response to the COVID 19 pandemic in 2021. It is the WHO's plan of action agreed upon by over 190 member states for pandemic prevention, preparedness and response. In 2020, Donald Trump, upon taking office as President of the United States, immediately withdrew the U. S. from the WHO due to the organization's mishandling of the COVID-19 pandemic, its failure to adopt reforms, its disproportionate payment demands from the U.S. and its inability to demonstrate independence from the inappropriate political influence of WHO member states.

On April 29, 2024, in a letter addressed to the WHO, the Regional Office for Americas, and the United Nations Headquarters, the Republic of Texas Vice President and Interim President Mike Blackwell gave official notice that the Republic of Texas, a nation by law of living men and women, rejects the World Health Organization's Pandemic Treaty. In the official notice, Mike Blackwell informs the WHO (created by the United Nations) that it has no authority or jurisdiction over the Republic of Texas or its living men and women. Not only is the Pandemic Treaty rejected, but the letter further notifies the WHO that they shall not try to implement this treaty on any land of the Republic of Texas or on any Texian. It prohibits any and/or all UNITED NATIONS and/or WHO personnel to be on the land of the Republic of Texas to enforce the World Health Organization's Pandemic Treaty.

On the surface, it may sound nice that leaders believe they have a "collective responsibility" to make certain the world is prepared for the next pandemic. By signing up for a top-down health system, however, the creativity and free-market for solutions from men and women all over the world is stifled and human rights laws are threatened. The men and women of the world must recognize this treaty is not a collective measure but an autocratic measure giving this organization of unelected diplomats too much power.

The men and women of the Republic of Texas stand peacefully and boldly grounded in truth against this pandemic agreement.

How do we move forward in wellness without a One Health System of so-called "experts" to "manage" our health?

The men and women of the Republic will determine at an individual level their health and wellness pursuits or lack thereof. Common Law Corner

Common Law courts are designed to address both criminal and civil matters since the Common Law court has universal jurisdiction over all legal matters within a community. The Jury system is the forum for settling both kinds of matters.

The matter is brought to the Sheriff and Coroner who then investigate and decide whether to present the case to the Grand Jury (25 jurists). The jurists review and investigate further, if necessary, and then if the evidence is strong enough, call for a Petit Jury (12 jurists) for a trial.

What is considered sufficient evidence to try the case? Only provable facts that are either certified by an independent party, presented by those who were involved or presented by those who were eyewitnesses are acceptable. "Hearsay" is not factual evidence and therefore unacceptable in the proceedings.

In the practice of Common Law, there are Counselors of Law who are consulted with for the preparation of the case to the court. They do not represent the Demandant (Plaintiff) or the Respondent (Defendant) in court. Each Texian must personally present his/her perspective on the facts of the matter. This is most often accompanied by sworn affidavits that are delivered to the jurists to review in advance. After their presentations, the jurists are given the opportunity to ask questions for clarification of the affidavits and the presentations. When all questions are answered, the jury adjourns to a private room to discuss and rule on the case.

As we study how Common Law works, we must keep in mind that Common Law IS the "law of the land" and IS the law for the Republic of Texas.
